

Mrs. John Hoodless (Adelaide Hunter Hoodless) was born on a farm at St. George in Grant County. She was a cultured and accomplished woman as well as a devoted wife and mother. Realizing the need for homemaking education, she devoted her life to this cause and was instrumental in organizing our first Institute at Stony Creek 1897.

The Homestead was made an Historic Site at an unveiling ceremony on June 13, 1959.

Mrs. Adelaide Hunter Hoodless was cited as a National Figure at an impressive unveiling of a plaque in her honour at the Homestead on June 2, 1962, by the National Historic Site Board.
