

Continued- THE LAY OF THE LAND

The 1965 and 1972 maps that follow give the lot numbers and property owners of families who lived on the Ranges, north east of Owen Sound. Part of Lot 9, Range 10, where Kenny is listed on the map, had belonged to the Walsh family. Stan, Stewart and Helen Walsh went to S.S.#5, Bothwell Corners School in 1947, when their pictures appear in the School history.

The Iredales lived immediately east of the Walshs on Lot 10 Range 10. The Gordon Iredale family had 104 acres here. They had moved to the area when Tracey and Agatha were past school age. Neither had ever married but participated in community activities, sports, Onwego Club and the Farm Forum Group.

The surnames of Grace, Pegelo, Thor, Earhart and Toms can be noted on the map as occupying land along the north side of Highway 26 at the east edge of the city.

Stories about the property on which the KOA camp, the Scenic City Golf Course, The Billy Bishop Airport etc. are located and written up under Business and Industry in Book 11 of these Tweedmuir History Books.

The west part of the S $\frac{1}{2}$ Lot 17, Con 10, is north of the KOA camp and is owned by Alton and Velma Hart. This farm, part of which has been sold to the KAO owners, was owned in the 1930's and early 1940's by Alvin and Doris Walter.

To the north of the Hart property is where Penny and Harvey Fenwick live. Their lot is S $\frac{1}{4}$ of Lot 17, Con.10. The Fenwicks were married on June 29th, 1974. They built a new home on the acreage. They have two children, Marci and Stacy. Penny has been involved with 4H Club Projects for many years, both as a student and as a leader.

Across the corner from the Fenwicks, on the hospital road is where Penny Fenwick's parents live. This property is Range 4, part of Lot 10. Tom Dinsmore is deceased but his wife Phyllis (Halliday) Dinsmore, Tom's wife still lives here (2002). Before the Dinsmores owned this farm a Mr. & Mrs Dunsmore lived here.

To the west of the Dinsmore land is GREENHAVEN. The story of Greenhaven is in Book 11 under Business and Industry. Across the road from the Dinsmore farm on 8th street, also called UNION ST. or the Hospital By-pass, was where Leonard Boyd lived. Leonard and Elsie Boyd had two daughters, Isabelle and Eileen. At one time Leonard's sister Wilma and her husband, Johnnie McKay had lived there. The property to-day is owned by the Lipsett family.

Travelling on Con.B and C north towards the hamlet of Annan, there are numerous severences, particularly on the west side of the road. These lots command a spectacular view of Georgian Bay.

Some people who have owned homes south of the Kirkwood subdivision on Con. B. are Tim Lemon, who later sold to Chris and Penny Carr, Clare and Nora Milhausen, the Starr family and others. Across from the Doctor's House B. & B. (parts of Lot 41 & 42), Joseph and Elke Lesich erected an impressive home up under the hill. On the same lot close to the road, the Lemon barn erected in the 1940's, is now also owned by Lesich and used for his construction business.

There are lot severences from the east end of several of the farms on Con. C. Some who have built new homes on these properties with access from the 8th Line are Barbara King and her husband John E. Muir, Bob and Margaret Whetstone, Bill Stewart, Gary Morrison and others.

Off Con.6, North of Highway 26, and across from the Silverthorn Century farm, there is the property, North $\frac{1}{2}$ of Lot 18, which was home at various times to Elgin and Laura McNab and to Elgin and Pat Fulford. Later Mr. & Mrs Gordon Hall owned this property. Mrs. Hall was a member of the local B. C. W. I. and led many 4H Clubs. A second house on this property was owned at one time by Mr. & Mrs Lorenzo Fulford. It is now owned by Bob and Marie Yates.
