S ½ Lot 2 Concession 6, Sydenham Township

Information was obtained from the Registry Office, Owen Sound and Linton Anderson, and compiled by Marion Martin, November 1974.

The first owners were John and Malcolm McEachern who purchased the land from the Crown in 1907 and contains 100 acres.

In 1921 George Carrie bought the farm and used the land for mixed farming.

In 1944 Pat Creigh bought a lot on the south west part of the property and built a house there. Harvey Taylor bought the house and lot in 1951. He moved the house to his farm at Massie and in 1955 sold the land back to George Carrie.

In 1959 Willard Hallman bought the farm from the George Carrie estate. He had the timber in the bush cut and taken to his mill at Walter's Falls. In 1960 Linton Anderson bought the farm and uses it for mixed farming. There are no buildings on the farm now.

Up-dated:

In 1977 Linton Anderson sold this farm to Ron Sword.

April 1989

After Pat (who had come from Ireland) bought this lot he bought a house that was located north of the barn on the adjacent Vair (now Longfield) farm to the south. He moved this house to his newly acquired lot.

The Bluewater Logging Company became the owner of the west fifty acres of this lot. It was divided into three lots consisting of eight and one half acres and one of thirty-three acres. Robert Neelands bought the most southerly in 1986 and had a log home erected on it by Allan Morrison. He moved in to this house in June 1989. In the spring of 1992, this house was sold to Randall and Heather (Manning) Thompson.
