A Glimpse Of The Past

30 YEARS AGO
 Last week's review of an ancient copy of The Post, printed in 1885, has brought to light a paper published 15 years earlier in the village of Neustadt. It is the May 6, 1869 issue of the "Waechter am Aaugeen", a German language weekly. Now in the possession of Ernie Logie of Hanover, it was the oldest of a pile of old journals discovered in the attic of the old Eberth Hotel, half a mile west of Hanover, on Highway 4.
