Corrie Johanna Saly was born in the Hague in Holland on September 18, 1924. She came to Canada in 1951, to care for her sister, because of an injury to her back.

In 1952, Corrie worked for a Dr. Cameron in Toronto for 4 months. Then she became a teller at the Dominion Bank on Bathurst Street.

In 1953, she married Wietse Van Dolder on May 21st. They have four children, Peter John, Robert, Wilma and Leola. They lived in Ballantrae for 13 years.

On June 8th, 1971 the Van Dolder family moved to Annan-Lot 34, Concession B. Peter, Leola and Robert live at Annan and Leith, and Wilma in Collingwood Township. They have ten grand-children.

Corrie was the president of the Annan Women's Institute in 1977-1980.

Corrie's husband Wietse passed away on November 21, 2000. Corrie plans to move to 2555 3rd Avenue West, Owen Sound in May 2002.

Corrie sold her property-Pt. Lot 34, Concession B to Robert and Kelly Van Dolder in 2002. The latter have done extensive renovations. Corrie reserved 50 acres.
