Approximately 95 women attended this all-day session from 14 local Women's Institute branches. Mrs. Neil Aldcorn, president, addressed the meeting on the

theme. She noted that one out of four weddings will break up and 60 per cent of the population believe that family life is less successful than ten years ago.

Mrs. William Middleton, Chesley, provincial board director for District 17 addressed the meeting on the workings of the Women's Institute at the provincial level. She noted that the Erland Lee
