



Grey Roots gives and grows trees during Earth Days

For Immediate Release – April 18, 2008

As part of Earth Day observances and as part of the world-wide effort to reforest our planet, from **Sunday, April 20 until April 22**, Grey Roots Museum & Archives will be handing out a White Pine Seedling, the Ontario provincial tree, to the first 100 people who visit the museum & archives.

Grey Roots also consulted a Forestry Technician with the Grey Sauble Conservation Authority to suggest what trees best suit the terrain and location of the Heritage Village - Moreston. With this advice, Grey Roots will plant 500 native seedlings in the Heritage Village later this month. Trees such as Eastern White Pine, Eastern White Cedar, Tamarack, Red Oak, and Silver Maple will be among the types of trees planted. These seedlings will join the 40 mature trees already in the Heritage Village that were donated to Grey Roots by Town and Country Garden Gallery, Owen Sound.
