



Volunteer Orientation and Open House at Grey Roots for National Volunteer Week

Volunteers will once more be in for a unique experience when they join Grey Roots Museum & Archives for the summer season. Grey Roots will be hosting a Volunteer Orientation and Open House on **April 20, 2009 from 1-3 p.m. and 6-8 p.m.** with a focus on volunteers interested in the Moreston Heritage Village and youth junior interpreters (13-17 years old) to assist with eight weeks of Summer KidsCamp.

Moreston is scheduled to open to the public on June 27, 2009. With more than five buildings open this summer including the Log Cabin, Log Home, Farm House, Bluewater Garage, and the new Rice Family Blacksmith Shop, more volunteers from the community will don authentic period costumes and share with visitors the stories and activities from pioneer days. In 2008, there were 169 active volunteers that donated over 10,000 hours of service.

Some of the ways Moreston volunteers will bring history to life and provide visitors the opportunity to step back in time are:

- Storytelling - volunteers will explain and demonstrate details of village life - they will explain how people lived, worked, and played in years past.
- Demonstrating – volunteers will engage in traditional trades include blacksmithing, spinning and gardening.
- Wearing period costumes - volunteers will be dressed in clothing representing the time period of the building they are in, rural Grey County in the 1850s and 1920s. Grey Roots needs volunteers to sew these period costumes.
- Assisting with Pioneer Life school programs

Moreston volunteers will be offered training in Grey County history, public speaking methods, period costuming, period vegetable and herb gardening, as well as craft and trades training such as spinning and blacksmithing. Community members who will most enjoy this volunteer program will love learning, history, and enjoy interacting directly with visitors from near and far.

In addition to training and interacting with others in Moreston, volunteers can take advantage of the many other benefits of volunteering at Grey Roots. Volunteers are able to visit Grey Roots free of charge after 20 completed hours of service, receive discounts in the gift shop, are covered by insurance while on duty, and can make new friends and celebrate their successes at volunteer appreciation events. Most importantly, they have the satisfaction of seeing Grey County's history preserved, shared, and enjoyed through their efforts.
